Know Your Voting Rights

If you are in line when polls are closing, stay in line - you have the right to vote.

If you make a mistake on your ballot, ask for a new one. You get up to 2 more ballots!

If the machines are down, ask for a paper ballot.

In Texas, you can bring an interpreter to assist you, if you

do not speak English.



About the City Council

The city council members along with the Mayor are elected every four years to represent your community.

All city council members are volunteers, but may receive a monthly stipend for expenses related to public service.

City council members are limited to serving two terms of four years each!



Why Our School Board Elections Matter

The link between the classroom and community is very real. Voting for school board members who share the same values and perspectives makes it more likely that schools will be run in a way that is best for our kids and community.

In many school district elections, less than a third of eligible voters vote. This year it is imperative for Texans to head to the polls as important decisions are being made that will affect the teaching and learning of our children, such as the books they read and their general safety.



What Does the School Board of Trustees Even Do?



Hiring the Big Boss

They hire the superintendent aka the Big Boss. The superintendent runs day-to-day operations of all schools.



Setting Policies

The school board creates policies on how schools should operate. This can range from technology, dress code, attendance rules, and more.



School Board Meetings

School board meetings are open to the public! If there is a problem or a new idea, they're the ones you talk to!




Representing the Community

They're elected by the community and for the community! They should be representative of your interests and wishes



School Board Trustees Do Not Get Paid.

School board members do not receive a salary, but may be reimbursed for expenses related to public service, this varies by school district.



So...What Does the Mayor Do?

In the simplest of words, the mayor is the head of the city and occupies the highest elective office in your town.

In Texas, a mayor is paid an average hourly pay of \$30.08 an hour. There have been salaries that range from as low as \$10.30 to as high as \$47.03.

Term: Four years maximum, of two terms.



The mayor serves as the leader of the town, representing their citizens and setting the overall vision and direction for the community.









2. Policy Maker

The mayor works with the city council members to develop and enact ordinances such as waste collection rules.

3. Economic Developer

That store you've been looking forward to come to town? Yes, it's their duty to promote economic development and growth.

4. Ceremonial Duties

The mayor presides over official ceremonies, events, and public functions representing your town.
